Region 13 Updates

Child Care Works Update!

- **MCCA Increase** - OCDEL is increasing the Maximum Child Care Allowance (MCCA) effective 1/1/2022. The MCCA is the highest rate OCDEL will allow the ELRC to pay for subsidized child care services.
- **Non-traditional Add-on** - Effective 1/1/22, a 25% add-on rate will be paid for a child who receives at least 2 hours of care during non-



traditional hours, which is defined as care between 6pm to 6 am on a weekday, or any care received on the weekend.

- Updated C-1 and updated published rates are due to the ELRC by 1/31/22.

American Rescue Plan Act (ARPA)

ARPA Grant applications are continuing to be processed. Providers who have not yet submitted their grant application will have until mid-January

Providers will receive 6 installments for the ARPA grant. Your last payment will be 6

Grant monitoring will take place in the summer of 2022 so it is important to keep receipts organized. Begin to track expenses into these categories:

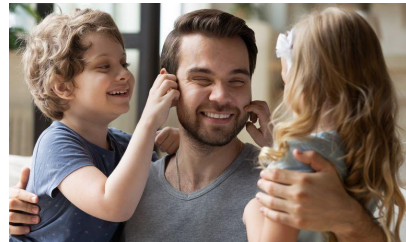
- Personnel costs

Co-Pay Updates

OCDEL will be using part of the American Rescue Plan Act (ARPA) funds to reduce family CCW co-pays. Adjustments will be made to families who qualify and you will be notified of any changes in January.

Inclement Weather and Winter Reminders

- Emergency Closures - if you are not able to update your closures through Provider Self Service, these must be reported within 3 business days of the closure to the ELRC.

- Drop-in Care - General payment practice does not cover the cost of drop-in care for children. If a parent requests a drop-in enrollment, for example a school snow day, usually it will be the parent's responsibility to cover the cost of care. Check with your provider specialist before expecting the ELRC to cover this child's enrollment.
- Invoices are due to the ELRC by the 5th of the month.

Health & Safety

Face Coverings

On 12/10/21, the Pennsylvania Supreme Court issued a ruling that ended the Secretary of Health's order that masks were required to be worn by children over two and by staff in a child care settings. This decision does not impact the Federal directive requiring all Head Start and Early Head Start programs or those driving and riding on school buses to continue to wear face coverings. While face coverings are still encouraged for children and staff, certification will no longer cite programs for noncompliance.

Reporting Communicable Diseases

With the addition of COVID-19 to the list of reportable communicable diseases, child care providers are reminded of certification regulations regarding reporting of these cases.

Any child or facility person reporting positive test results or showing symptoms of COVID-19, cannot be in attendance at the child care facility. Upon return, the individual must provide a written note or a negative test result signed and verified by a physician or nurse practitioner (CRNP) clearing them to return to the child care facility. A home test or any other negative test results that have not been reviewed, signed and verified by a

physician or CRNP will not be acceptable for a child or a facility person to return to the child care facility.
