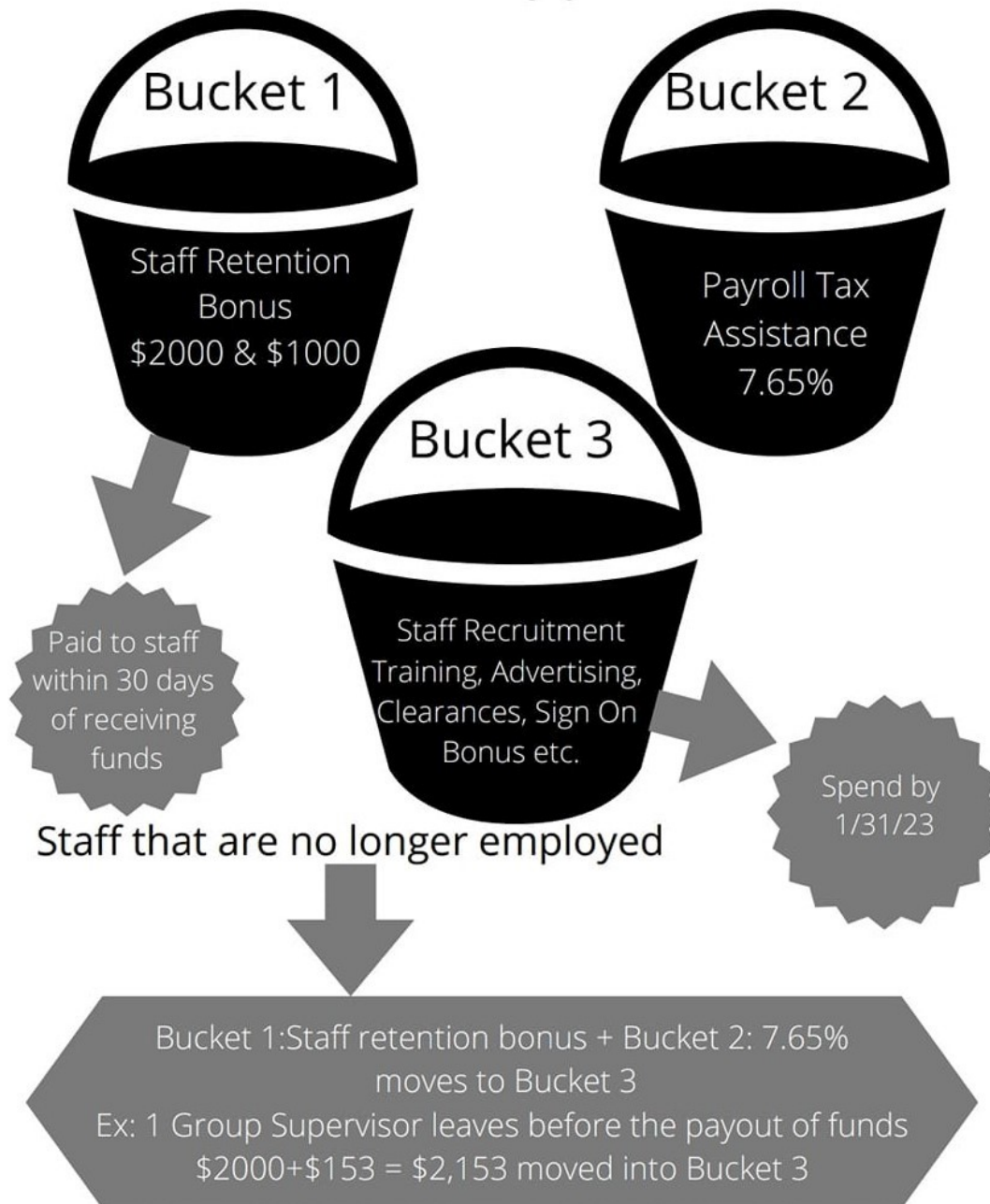
### Workforce Support Grant Payments

All Work Force Support Grant payments have been issued. Reminder that all staff retention amounts must be paid out to staff within 30 days of receipt of the

- Complete the report, fully accounting for all funds. **Amounts reported for Bucket 1 & 2 cannot exceed the amount received.**

## CCW Reminders

- Please remember to report excessive child absences, late starts and terminations prior to invoicing time. Children exceeding 5 consecutive days of absences need to be reported immediately. If these circumstances are reported as they occur, the corrections may already be reflected on your attendance invoice making it easier for you to complete the monthly attendance accurately.
- Reporting co-pay delinquencies timely. If you attempt to report more than one week, the ELRC will be unable to pursue the outstanding weeks with the family.



## Child Care Works Required Training

As of 8/30/22, all child care staff (in a program that participates in CCW), are required to take a 1 hour annual training in Child Development each fiscal year. This training will count toward the 12 hour annual training for certification. In addition, all leadership staff who have a role in processing CCW payments must take the PD “CCW Program Integrity & Accountability Training” by 11/30/22. This training is a free, one-hour session and is available in both English and Spanish on the PD Registry.

All programs who have a Child Care Works agreement with the ELRC, must complete Appendix I - Attestation of PD, and return to the ELRC by 12/30/22. Failure to complete the attestation and return to ELRC will result in the termination of the CCW Agreement. Click [here](#) to access the Attestation.

## 2022 Market Rate Survey - Closes 10/11/22

OCDEL is requesting all providers complete the 2022 Child Care Market Rate Survey! The facility’s director, owner, or other person who is knowledgeable about the facility’s operations and finances should be the one to complete this survey. This includes questions about private pay tuition rates, payments and fees, Child Care Works program participation, enrollment, staffing, and operations. Private pay tuition rates collected from this survey will be used to update a facility’s rates in the PELICAN system. Rates from PELICAN are also displayed publicly on websites such as the Compass Provider search.

## Public Loan Forgiveness

The COVID-19 pandemic resulted in financial hardship for many, including members of the early care and education (ECE) workforce. If you work for a qualified employer, including many Head

Start, preschool and child care programs, you may now be eligible for federal student loan forgiveness for your important public service. Some borrowers will need to consolidate their federal loans and/or submit a PSLF form by October 31, 2022, to take advantage of this opportunity.

## Fire Prevention

October is Fire Prevention Month! The National Fire Prevention Association (NFPA) has an abundance of resources available on their website, including lesson plans and classroom activity ideas.

## Helping Children Stop Using a Pacifier



Below are some tips you can share with families who struggle to have their child wean off a pacifier.

- **Talk to your child** - Tell the child why you want them to stop using their pacifier. Say to them you believe they can stop.
- **Take the pacifier away gradually** - Let the child use it only at certain times, like naptime or bedtime. Slowly increase the amount of time that the child isn't using a pacifier.
- **Reward the child** - For each day they don't use their pacifier, put a star on the calendar. At the end of an agreed upon time period, give them a non-food reward, like a trip to the park.
- **Encourage the child to throw their pacifier away** - If the child asks for it, remind them that they threw it away. Tell the child they're a big kid, and big kids don't use pacifiers.
- **Trade the pacifier** - Ask the child to put the pacifier under their pillow. Tell them the pacifier fairy or someone else will take the pacifier while they sleep and leave a gift instead. If the child asks for the pacifier, remind them they traded it for a gift.
- **Poke holes in the pacifier** - Use a clean pin to make the holes. If the pacifier has holes in it, it won't feel good for the child to suck on.
