# **ELRC Updates**

## **CCW** updates

### Increase in CCW Base Payment Rates!

OCDEL has released <u>Announcement ELRC23-01.</u> This announcement is notification of an increase to base rates paid by PA Department of Human Services (DHS) to certified child care providers participating in Child Care Works (CCW). Base payment rates are also known as the Maximum Child Care Allowance (MCCA). The new MCCA chart is posted <u>here.</u>

If the provider's:

- private pay rates are HIGHER than the newly published MCCA, participating DHS providers will not have to submit a new Appendix C-1. The new rates will automatically be reflected in the payment for March.
- private-pay rate is LOWER than the new MCCA, they will receive the lower of the two rates.
- would like to update their private pay rates, communicate those changes to families and provide verification of the updated child care rates to the ELRC. The updated rate will become effective the first of the month following the date the verification was received by the ELRC.

#### **Registration Fees**

Effective January 1, 2023, Early Learning Resource Centers began paying a registration fee to DHS certified child care providers for all CCW children at the time of their initial enrollment. Registration fees for newly enrolled children will automatically be added to the provider invoice for the service period in which the enrollment was effective. No further action will be required. Effective January 1, 2023, providers cannot charge CCW families registration fees or the difference between what the ELRC pays for a registration fee and what the provider charges private pay families for a registration fee. (\$75 for centers, \$50 for group/family providers).

**Annual Registration Fees** - If you charge an annual re-registration fee, the ELRC will pay this registration fee for your CCW enrolled children. This fee must be requested using the following form:

Prior to authorizing these annual fees, the ELRC must receive a one-time verification of these charges. This may include a copy of your family handbook or

family contract that states all families are charged an annual fee every year.

Please note that the ELRC will not pay any other type of fee such as waitlist fees, field trip fees, etc. If you have any questions, you can click <u>here</u> to read the full announcement or reach out to your Provider Specialist.

#### **CCW Reminders**

- Remember to report all children who are absent more than 5 consecutive days to your provider specialist prior to submitting your invoice.
- If you accept the blended rate, you are receiving a higher reimbursement amount for school age children to account for school closing days, inclement weather and other emergencies. Accommodations must be made to accept CCW school-age children for these full days of care if you have accepted the blended rate. Please reach out to your provider specialist with any questions regarding this expectation.

## Medicaid and CHIP Renewals

Starting April 1, 2023, Pennsylvania is required by federal law to review Medicaid and CHIP recipients' eligibility every year, which means that recipients must submit a renewal.

It is very important that renewal forms are completed and

returned even if nothing has changed. Completing a renewal allows DHS to determine eligibility for MA or CHIP coverage. Coverage will continue for recipients who are still eligible.

There are a few ways for recipients to complete a renewal:

- Complete the forms DHS sends and mail them back in the envelope included in the packet.
- Drop completed forms off at the local county assistance office (CAO).
- Complete the renewal online at <u>dhs.pa.gov/COMPASS.</u>
- Complete the renewal over the phone by calling 1-866-550-4355.

Make sure contact information is correct with DHS. Recipients can opt-in to receive text messages and email alerts about their benefits.

- Visit <u>COMPASS</u> and log into their My COMPASS Account.
- Use the free <u>myCOMPASS PA</u> mobile app.
- Call 1-877-395-8930

## **Oral Health Tip - Please Share with Families**

Before visiting a dentist, it is very helpful if a child's parent or guardian completes this form: <u>Getting to Know Me: Information for Your Child's Dental</u> <u>Office</u>. The form gathers information about the child's ability to cooperate during dental visits. It also includes suggestions about approaches that might work best for the child. This information will help the dental office staff understand and meet the child's needs.
