# **CCW Reminders**

- Click <u>here</u> for the updated CCW payment schedule for 2023-2024. Please note the attendance due date to receive timely payment and submit to the ELRC.
- The School Age Flip occurred on June 14. As a reminder, providers who have accepted the blended rate have been paid a higher part-time rate which includes 25 full-time days throughout the school year. This accounts for any gaps that may have occurred between your local school district end date and school age flip date.

- As always, review your invoices carefully to ensure the schedules are correct.
- Child Care Works will pay for 40 absences per child for the year. These absences reset back to zero on 7/1/23.

#### **Transition Packets**

Summer camps have started and programs are preparing for their Fall enrollments! As you begin to set schedules and arrange classrooms for the new school year, think about how the children will transition to their new teachers and classrooms.



STAR indicator FC2.2, requires providers to have a policy to demonstrate how children are helped to transition between developmental stages. Transition information should be provided to parents at least a week in advance. Information can include a letter outlining how the child will gradually transition into the new classroom, what to expect on the first day and staff schedules and contact phone numbers. Packets can also include copies of daily schedules, teacher welcome letters and samples of lesson plans. Make sure parents are aware of any classroom expectations like potty training, daily communication methods and where the child's personal belonnings can be stored, like in a cubby. Providing clear communication will allow parents and children to feel confident about this exciting next step!

# Health & Safety

### Tick Safety

What should child care providers do when they find a tick on a child?



OCDEL Certification recommends that if a childcare provider finds an embedded tick, they should immediately contact the child's parent or guardian so that next steps can be determined quickly. This is consistent with regulation 132(a). It is advised that a provider does not remove a tick unless there is written authorization by the parent and the provider has received the appropriate health and safety training to do so. Following proper technique for tick removal can be challenging; even with proper technique, heads can stay attached and need to be dug out, which can be difficult.

# Air Quality Alerts

The recent air quality alerts due to the wildfires in Canada prompted programs to re-examine their outdoor policies and communcation of those policies to families. Take a look at your parent handbook and check to see if there is guidance regarding daily outdoor play, weather permitting.

When weather poses a significant risk, children should remain indoors. The PA Position Statement defines weather permitting as:

- Temperature/wind chill is above 25 degrees
- Heat index is less than 90 degrees
- No precipitation falling
- No current air quality alert

# Setting Oral Health Goals

Goal setting can help you create new behaviors and it can also allow you to measure your progress. Goals also give you the motivation to maintain healthy oral health habits.

Healthy oral health habits include:

- Regular dental visits and treatment
- Healthy snacks

- Brush with fluoride toothpaste at least twice a day
- No sugary beverages
- $\cdot$   $\,$  No bottle for bed  $\,$
- Water or milk only in sippy cups
- Drink tap water
- Avoid or limit junk food and candy
- Limit sugar and consider sugar substitutes
- $\cdot$   $\;$  Last thing to touch teeth before bed is toothbrush with fluorinated toothpaste
