ELRC Updates

CCW Reminders

- As you prepare for Fall enrollments, please report school year changes to your Provider Specialist
- School-age children will revert back to the part-time, school year rate on September 1st.

• It is important to always review invoices for accuracy. Children who are missing from your invoice must be added timely. Also check to ensure any children who have changes to enrollment or left care, are accurately reflected on your invoice each month.

Registration Fees

As of January 1st, 2023, certified child care providers receive a registration fee for all newly enrolled CCW children. This registration fee is automatically added to the provider invoice for the service period in which the enrollment was effective, regardless of whether the provider charges a registration fee.

Providers *cannot* charge CCW families an additional registration fee or the difference between the ELRC's registration fee and what the provider charges private pay families for a registration fee. *Charging CCW families a registration fee could result in termination of the provider agreement*.

- Child Care Centers \$75
- Group Child Care Homes \$50
- Family Child Care Homes \$50

Annual Registration Fees

If you charge an annual re-registration fee, the ELRC will pay this fee for your CCW enrolled children. This fee must be requested using the following form: <u>Annual Registration Fee Form</u>

Prior to authorizing these annual fees, the ELRC must receive a one-time verification of these charges. This may include a copy of your family handbook or family contract that states all families are charged an annual fee every year.

Please note that the ELRC will not pay any other type of fee such as waitlist fees, field trip fees, etc.

PQAS Cohort

Have you considered applying for a PQAS certification? The Pennsylvania Quality Assurance System (PQAS) maintains a registry of approved Professional Development Instructors and Technical Assistance Consultants/Coaches to help ensure that professional development activities and technical assistance meet quality standards. Professionals who receive their PQAS certification can

- enter trainings on the PD Registry
- issue training hours to their own staff which are accepted by certification and Keystone STARS
- partner with the ELRC to deliver PAID trainings to other child care providers.

The ELRC is forming a FREE cohort of professionals interested in becoming PQAS certified to work together through the process. In order to be eligible for this cohort, candidates must:

- work in ELRC Regions 11, 12, 13, 14 or 16
- be approved at a level C or above on the Career Pathway
- have experience training (formally or informally) others within the last 5 years

New Fire Safety Requirements

All DHS certified group child care homes (in a residence) and family child care homes **must** maintain compliance with the applicable fire safety laws contained in the Human Services Code; the Fire and Panic Act (family child care



homes only); the Pennsylvania Construction Code; and applicable regulations relating to smoke alarms or systems. Smoke alarms or systems **must always** be operable.

All DHS certified child care centers and group child care homes (in a commercial space) **must** maintain compliance with the applicable fire safety laws contained in the Human Services Code, the Pennsylvania Construction Code, and applicable regulations relating to fire detection devices or systems. Fire detection devices or systems **must always** be operable.

Supervision & Ratios

As you begin to plan your classroom enrollments and staffing for the Fall, be sure all rooms are fully covered to meet not only the ratios required, but the correct staffing components. Aides cannot be left alone with children so creative scheduling and combining of classrooms in the beginning and end of the day may be necessary. It is also important to factor in emergencies like staff illness or a child who needs temporary one on one attention. A floater or administrative support person who can help cover classrooms is necessary, especially for larger programs.

Reading to Children about Oral Health
