Child Care Works Reminders

Winter Weather Closures

This is the time of year when winter weather can prompt program closures. Providers who use PSS will have until the 5th of the following month to report closures. Providers who do not use PSS



must contact their provider specialist within three days of reopening the facility in order to receive a paid closure.

The subsidy program will pay for a maximum of 15 closed days per year from July 1 through June 30th for which the provider also charges private-pay families.

40 Day Absence Policy

Remember to report child absences accurately on your invoice each month. CCW enrolled children are allowed up to 40 absences from July 1 - June 30th. Failure to report absences timely may result in enrollees exceeded the 40 days limit, thus making those days ineligible for payment to the provider.

Annual Registration Fees for CCW Children

OCDEL has been paying for registration fees for all newly enrolled CCW children since January 2023. This registration fee is automatically added to the provider



invoice for the service period in which the enrollment was effective, regardless of whether the provider charges a registration fee. If you charge all families an additional **annual registration fee**, you can request that this fee also be paid by the ELRC for all enrolled CCW children. Verification of this charge, through a family handbook policy or service agreement for example, must be sent along with the request form. Please note that providers cannot charge CCW families registration fees or the difference between what the ELRC pays for a registration fee and what the provider charges private pay families. ELRC will not pay any other type of fee such as waitlist fees, field trip fees, etc.

Continuous Quality Improvement Grant

The Office of Child Development and Early Learning (OCDEL) has announced a new grant opportunity for STAR 2, 3 & 4 providers. This one-time award will allow programs to maintain and invest in quality activities and expenditures that

will positively impact the children in their care.

Please read through the <u>ELRC Policy Communication</u> and <u>FAQ document</u> for full award eligibility and grant details. Let your Quality Coach know if you have any questions.

Eligible providers should have received their award letter. If you have not received it, please reach out to your Quality Coach who can forward the letter to you. This grant must be accepted or declined by **February 15, 2024**.
