ELRC Updates

Child Care Works Reminders

Communications with your ELRC Provider Specialist are critical in keeping your payments accurate and timely. Remember to report:

- When a child stops attending
- If a location is closing
- If children transfer to a different location within your legal entity

40 Day Absence Policy

Remember to report child absences accurately on your invoice each month. CCW enrolled children are allowed up to 40 absences from July 1 - June 30th. Failure to report absences timely may result in enrollees exceeding the 40 day limit, thus making those days ineligible for payment to the provider.

Continuous Quality Improvement Grant

The Office of Child Development and Early Learning (OCDEL) has announced a new grant opportunity for STAR 2, 3 & 4 providers. This one-time award will allow programs to maintain and invest in quality activities and expenditures that

will positively impact the children in their care.

Eligible providers should have received their award letter. If you have not received it, please reach out to your Quality Coach who can forward the letter to you. This grant must be accepted or declined by **February 15, 2024**.

Keystone STARS Reminders

OCDEL Approved Curricula & Assessment Tools STAR 3 and 4 providers use an OCDEL-approved curricula and child assessment in order to earn points in EC 3.4.1 and EC 3.4.2. Only current OCDEL-approved curricula and developmental assessment tools will be accepted in meeting these standards.

To verify that your selected curriculum and child assessment tool is still approved, you can reference the Department of Education listing <u>here</u>.

Health & Safety

STAYING HEALTHY DURING THE WINTER SEASON

for Early Learning Professionals



Share information about new and/or updated health policies and practices with colleagues and families. (<u>Better Kid Care</u>)



Support outdoor play at your early learning program during the colder months. (Penn State Extension)

Support staff in taking steps to maintain their mental health, like getting outside and exercising, keeping up healthy eating and sleep habits, having a support system and staying connected, and practicing mindfulness and meditating. (Lifespan) All Pennsylvania early childhood professionals have <u>free access</u> to the Healthy Minds app, Healthy Minds@Work.



Practice recommendations to keep staff and children healthy. (<u>CDC</u>)

- Remind families and staff about policies for ill children and staff.
- Stay home when sick.
- Ensure proper ventilation
- Practice hand hygiene and respiratory etiquette.
- Clean surfaces at least once a day to reduce the risk of germs spreading by touching surfaces. Establish a Routine Schedule for Cleaning, Sanitizing and Disinfecting, Appendix K from Caring for Our Children, updated July 2022. (<u>nrckids.org</u>)

Check the expiration date and batteries of smoke and carbon monoxide detectors, and expiration dates of fire extinguishers in your facility. Replace as necessary. (National Fire Protection Association) Certified child care in Pennsylvania can get two free carbon monoxide detectors for their facility. (The Pennsylvania Key)



National Children's Dental Health Month

February is National Children's Dental Health Month. This month-long national health observance brings together thousands of dedicated professionals, healthcare providers, and educators to promote the benefits of good oral health to children, their caregivers, teachers, and many others. The 2024 theme is "Healthy Habits for Healthy Smiles." The American Dental Association has free downloadable posters, postcards, and flyers available on their website. Oral Health - Choosing Healthy Drinks for Young Children

Providers should be mindful about what drinks are served to children while in care. Limit drinks with natural or added sugar. Even 100% fruit juice is full of sugar that can lead to tooth decay.

Tips for Choosing Healthy Drinks:

- Give children plain water with fluoride. Water from the tap (faucet) is safe and cheap.
- Give children milk at scheduled meal and snack times.
- Do not lay a child down for nap with a bottle or sippy cup. If you do, the bottle or sippy cup should contain only water, nothing else.
- Give children cut-up or whole fruit instead of fruit juice.
