June Invoices

All providers must submit their June invoice no later than July 30th. While other months allow for a 60 day window to submit invoices, due to the close of the ELRC fiscal year, all invoices must be closed out by the end of July. Invoices received beyond July 30th may not be paid.

School Age Flip

The ELRC is preparing for the change in schedules for school-age children over the summer months. The school age flip from part-time to full-time for all eligible school age enrollments and eligible PKC and Head Start children, will take place on **June 14, 2024**. 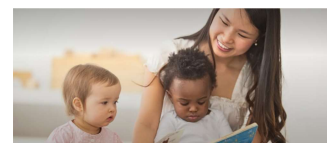

Dual Language Labels

Young children who are Dual Language Learners can be a challenge to child care teachers because they may not understand the teacher's directions or what is being asked of them in their classroom. One way that preschool teachers can support Dual Language Learners is to provide labels for the classroom environment, toys, and materials that children access all day. Families are often eager to participate in helping their child's teacher by providing words and phrases that can be used on classroom labels. The United Way of Berks County has created a list of English/Spanish words that can be used in any child care classroom. Feel free to use these [labels](#) in your program to assist your Spanish-speaking students. They can also be helpful for Spanish-speaking staff who have English speakers in their classrooms. All students can benefit from environmental print-rich classrooms.

Health & Safety

Summer Water Safety



As programs start their summer day camp programs and other fun water activities, it's critical to adhere to water play regulations and review supervision practices with your staff. It takes only a small distraction to result in a child drowning or near drowning!

Remember that ratios change when children are swimming:

- Infant - 1 staff to 1 child
- Young or Older Toddler - 1 staff to 2 children
- Preschool - 1 staff to 5 children
- Young School Age - 1 staff to 6 children
- Older School Age - 1 staff to 8 children

Regulations also require each child care provider have a facility person certified

as a lifeguard to supervise children when swimming. The lifeguard is not counted in the required staff to child ratio.

Helping Children Stop Using a Pacifier

Sucking on pacifiers is a normal reflex for infants and toddlers. However, long-term use of pacifiers can affect a child's bite and the growth of the jaws and bones that support their teeth. If a child shows no interest in giving up their pacifier by age 4, they may need help to stop.



Here are some ways to help a child stop using their pacifier.

- **Talk to the child.** Tell the child why you want them to stop using their pacifier. Say to them you believe they can stop.
- **Take the pacifier away gradually.** Let the child use it only at certain times, like naptime or bedtime. Slowly increase the amount of time that the child isn't using a pacifier.
- **Reward the child.** For each day they don't use their pacifier, put a star on the calendar. At the end of an agreed upon time period, give them a non-food reward, like a trip to the park.
- **Encourage the child to throw their pacifier away.** If the child asks for it, remind them that they threw it away. Tell the child they're a big kid, and big kids don't use pacifiers.
- **Trade the pacifier.** Ask the child to put the pacifier under their pillow. Tell them the pacifier fairy or someone else will take the pacifier while they sleep and leave a gift instead. If the child asks for the pacifier, remind them they traded it for a gift.
- **Poke holes in the pacifier.** Use a clean pin to make the holes. If the pacifier has holes in it, it won't feel good for the child to suck on.

Safety Recall

- U.S. Consumer Product Safety Commission's recall of [Dixon Ticonderoga Creativity Street Foam Pattern Rollers](#), typically used for painting by children, because their lead levels exceed the federal content ban.
- Huihuang Trading is recalling 200 fishing game toys because they contain small high-powered magnets. If children swallow the magnets, they can suffer serious injuries or death. The fishing game toys were sold on Amazon.com from June to July 2023 for \$20 to \$25. Email safety@operationagency.com for a refund.
- Lolanta is recalling 16,900 children's hooded flannel robes sold in sizes 2-3 years, 3-5 years and 6-8 years on lolanta.com and Amazon.com from January 2021 to October 2023 for about \$30.
