## ELRC Updates

### CCW Reminders

#### Provider Self Service Users-Closed Days

The ELRC sent copies of the Appendix B: 2024-2025 Closed Days to all Providers with the new Provider Agreements. If you are Provider Self Service (PSS) user and updated your closed days for 2024-2025 when completing your new Provider Agreement, please go into PSS and update your closed days. The ELRC cannot update closed days for PSS users. Please contact your Provider Specialist if you have any questions.

- As you prepare for Fall enrollments, please report school year changes to your Provider Specialist
- School-age children will revert back to the part-time, school year rate on **September 2<sup>nd</sup>**. Please be sure to check your September invoice to make sure all of your School Age children flipped to the part-time blended rate and that their schedules are correct.
- It is important to always review invoices for accuracy. Children who are missing from your invoice must be added timely. Also, check to ensure any children who have changes to enrollment or left care are corrected on your

The intent of the Awards is to improve, support, and recognize the quality of Pennsylvania's early learning and school-age programs that are invested in the Keystone STARS Program.

Providers in ELRC Regions 11, 12, 13, 14 & 16 will be emailed their acceptance letter. If you are expecting a letter but do not receive it by the end of September, please reach out to your Quality Coach.

### Apple Juice Recall

The US Food and Drug Administration (FDA) website indicates that more than 9,500 cases of Great Value apple juice sold at Walmart stores across 25 states has been recalled by Walmart's juice supplier. Reportedly the juice contains 13.2 parts per billion (ppb) inorganic arsenic, which exceeds the FDA set limit of 10 ppb.

### How Smoking Affects Oral Health

Smoking can lead to disease and disability, harming nearly every bodily organ. More than 16 million Americans are living with a disease caused by smoking. Secondhand smoke is also dangerous to both adults and children.

Smoking traditional cigarettes, e-cigarettes, cigars, pipes, water pipes, and smokeless tobacco can all cause health problems. Smoking makes it more likely that a person will have tooth decay, gum disease, oral cancer, and poor birth outcomes. It also causes stained teeth, bad breath, and reduced ability to taste and smell.

Not smoking or quitting smoking is important for overall health, including oral health. When a smoker quits, it improves their health and quality of life. It also improves the health and quality of life of those around them, especially young children.
